2016 Annual Accreditation based on 2015 data

Dear Endocentre lead and Endocentre Nurse

Now 2015 is complete, we have audited the annual data from all BSGE Endocentres and write with the results. The data presented are the data that Endocentres have entered and if there are any errors, please check with your own records before raising issues with BSGE Secretariat. If you identify a genuine error, please email the details to the BSGE Secretariat at bsge@rcog.org.uk before end of January 2016. After this data will be finalised and published.

Any appeal about failure to become accredited must be lodged by end of January and please use the published <u>appeals</u> process.

It is important that all information displayed about a centre on the <u>BSGE website</u> should be correct and up to date. Centre leads should inform the BSGE Secretariat if there are any changes to their team. To add new team members, please complete the attached form and send it back to Atia Khan at the RCOG to process it. The BSGE website will be updated week beginning 1st February after the end of appeal process. It is especially important that the Gynaecological surgeons are correctly listed as this will define the number of cases the centre will need to achieve to continue accreditation in 2017 (see below).

The tables that follow show the total number of pararectal dissection cases for each centre, the type of bowel surgery performed and the proportion of cases done laparoscopically. For the first time we are able to report on the follow up performance for each centre. The database can calculate how many follow up appointments should have been entered, based on date and type of surgery, and can measure how many were actually entered, this generates a percentage figure to show a comparable performance for each centre. Obviously we are aiming for 100% in this performance. As you know many of the recent changes to the database were done to improve data completeness and follow up performance. The systems have made it easier, so now it is interesting to see how each centre performs. Most of us need to work a lot harder with our teams to improve this. It is essential that we all have good follow up data otherwise we have no outcome data to confirm the effect of our surgery to our patients and our Trusts.

2015 was a busy year for the Endocentre project, so we thought it would be helpful to reflect on what has been achieved.

A guick reminder of what has been achieved in 2015:

- Major database upgrade to make it easier to collect complete data.
- Email system introduced to allow patients to enter responses direct.
- Video training for the database available on line.
- RCN recognition of the Endometriosis Nurse Specialist role.
- NHS England specialist commissioning using BSGE data
- Endocentre workload data publication for the general public
- Endometriosis nurse training incorporated in to the BSGE ASM
- Presentation of BSGE data on over 3,500 cases of severe RVE at ESGE.

In 2016 developments will continue with:

- Introduction of the exemplar video of pararectal surgery case to be submitted to BSGE secretariat from each centre by end of April 2016.
- Publication of detailed data analysis on surgical outcome to all centres.
- Publication of overall data on post-surgery outcome to the public
- Presentation of BSGE data on over 3,500 cases of severe RVE at RCOG world congress and BSGE ASM.
- Publication of the first two Scientific papers form the BSGE Endocentre project

In 2017 developments will continue with:

 BSGE Endocentre accreditation criteria of workload will change. Instead of 12 cases of pararectal dissection per centre, it will become 12 cases allocated for each surgeon to establish the Endocentre's accreditation criteria. If one Gynaecological surgeon is listed 12 cases will be the requirement for the centre, if two this will become 24, three will be 36 etc. The accreditation will be based on the total number of cases not each individual surgeon performing 12 cases.

2015 Results

The data for 2015 have been analysed and are reported in the tables below; we are delighted to report that the number of cases of pararectal dissection for severe rectovaginal endometriosis has risen once again. There were 1247 cases in Accredited centres with 49 bowel resections. All Accredited centres have performed enough procedures to retain accreditation for 2016. They will however need to submit an exemplar video **before 30th April 2016** to retain this accreditation.

There were 126 cases in Provisional centres with 13 bowel resections. All but four of the Provisional centres performed enough cases to be accredited. The Provisional centres with insufficient workload will be removed from the list altogether. There are new hospitals aspiring to be accredited centres and they will form the Provisional centres for 2016.

Consequently in 2016 there will be 50 Accredited Endometriosis Centres. Interestingly this is about the number we expected to be needed. However we expect that with appropriate inter-hospital referral of patients to these centres' workloads should rise to 70 - 100 cases annually.

Our modelling predicts that there should be one case per 10,000 total (male and female) population. So a hospital with a 500K catchment should be expecting 50 cases annually, one million catchment means 100 cases annually, etc.

The total number of pararectal dissection cases for 2015 is 1373 cases, which include 62 cases of segmental bowel resection. These data will make the database a very powerful dataset and likely provide the most comprehensive evidence on surgical treatment of severe rectovaginal endometriosis. However it will only be valid if the follow up is complete, so please all **review your follow up performance** and if it is poor you need to work on this aspect urgently.



If a centre wishes to appeal their data there is now an appeals process and this can be found in the Endocentre database under the 'Help/Downloads' section. No other process for appeal will be accepted. The document is also available on the members section of the BSGE website under the Endometriosis Centres tab labelled 're-application and appeals process'. Once the time for appeal has passed and data is closed it will be added to the BSGE website.

Once again thank you for all your hard work. Every person in the centres teams is contributing to improving care for women with Endometriosis and helping improve the knowledge base of this devastating condition. Well done.
